Course difficulty should be decided by the group leader not the Centre staff. There is a choice of easy or difficult course to suit different age and ability of groups. The group leader should decide what size groups do what course and with what level of supervision as they know their group better than Centre staff do. After a set time period a gong/whistle should be sounded to let participants know the activity is over – they can then head back towards the sound
