Danger of falling branches from overhanging trees	All	Surrounding area checked regularly for loose branches by centre staff.  Yearly tree inspection carried out by qualified professional.	
Person being hit with river dipping net	All	Leader should make clear to group within instructions that nets are not to be carried over shoulders	
Risk of water borne disease contraction.	All	Groups should be made aware that open cuts must be covered and made water proof other wise the individual will not be allowed to participate in activity.  Hands washed immediately after activity
