Site of the fire and general considerations:		<ul> <li>Ensure site of fire is appropriate</li> <li>→ Swing wood</li> <li>→ Kestrel wood</li> <li>→ Inside the fire pits</li> <li>→ NOT on top of concrete</li> </ul>	→ Ensure WHCC activity leader is experienced and confident the activity and that other supervisors are around and aware of locations of fire.
		<ul> <li>Consider</li> <li>→ Wind direction</li> <li>→ On wet days activity may be cancelled</li> <li>→ Appropriate ratio of staff to students</li> <li>→ Tie long hair back</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>→ Groups must have an unobstructed view of the red fire box, fire extinguishers and fire bucket from their location.</li> <li>→ First aid kit must be on hand including access to cold water.</li> </ul>

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	<ul> <li>→ Clothing must be zipped up, not loose.</li> <li>→ Any dangling items e.g. hoodie toggles, ID badges, hair, etc, to be tucked in or tied back.</li> <li>→ First aid kit &amp; fire fighting equipment must be on site.</li> </ul>	
Collection of fire wood → Eye pokers → Scratches → Nettle stings → Foot injury → Splinters → Wandering off	<ul> <li>→ Demonstrate size of wood to be collected, both thickness and length.</li> <li>→ Prompt slow walking, no running.</li> <li>→ Identify brambles and nettles to group to avoid touching these plants.</li> <li>→ Agree boundaries.</li> </ul>	Adult supervision and modelling of behaviours

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Cooking on fire → Burns	<ul> <li>→ Where a grid is, is where a fire is/was, a hot spot.</li> <li>→ Ensure fire grid is stable and level.</li> <li>→ Ensure pans are stable and level.</li> <li>→ Reminder that pans &amp; utensils will get hot. Adult support required.</li> <li>→ Use long handled spoons and forks/fish slices to turn food.</li> <li>→ Adult to ensure food is cooked &amp; have food hygiene certificate</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>→ Adult supervision at all times</li> <li>→ Adult support with cooking and moving pans from fire.</li> <li>→ Cold water close by.</li> <li>→ First aider present.</li> <li>→ Use of heat resistant gloves.</li> </ul>
→ Hygiene	<ul> <li>→ Wash hands before activity and eating.</li> <li>→ Hand cleaning available.</li> </ul>	
Extinguishing fires: → Burns and scalds	<ul> <li>→ Only WHCC staff should extinguish fires and check the fire sites for coolness.</li> <li>→ Leave area as found.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>→ Ashes and charred sticks should be spread over the area and totally extinguished.</li> <li>→ WHCC staff to check area after activity</li> </ul>
