

There is a risk that participants on the walk could become separated from the rest of the group and become lost.	All members of the group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>→ A member of group or WHCC staff should always be placed at the rear of the group to ensure no body is left behind</li> <li>→ Within the introduction ensure that the group must stay together.</li> </ul>	
There is a heightened risk of slips trips and falls as daylight fails	All members of the group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>→ Group members should have a small torch that can be switched on once the natural light has completely failed at the direction and instruction from WHCC staff.</li> </ul>	
Injury from inappropriate behaviour / not listening / not following instructions	All members of the group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>→ WHCC staff will look to group staff to control behaviour</li> </ul>	

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
