Specifically, person/s/children involved in delivering and receiving activities supplied by WHCC staff. 	 Government / senior / overseeing organisations guidelines followed. All WHCC staff briefed and carrying out the policy documented practices. Any need to be in close proximity such as leading activities, will be kept to a minimum with other precautions and PPE in place. Masks/face shields to be worn at the discretion of the group leader / WHCC staff. This may lead to WHCC staff wearing them and not the group or vice-a-versa. Hand washing must continue alongside the use of alcohol hand sanitiser using a good hand rubbing technique. Children can use alcohol hand sanitiser, with adult supervision, no more than a pea sized amount used and using a good hand rubbing technique. Visual hand washing posters to be displayed where hand 	

washing facilities are
positioned.
Any potentially contaminated
waste, e.g. gloves or masks,
should be disposed of in a
yellow biohazard bin bagged bin
or double lined bag in general
waste.
Staff members provided with
suitable PPE for the job being
undertaken.
All hands to be washed and/or
sanitised (depending on age)
prior and after the activity.
Hand washing facilities of some
kind to be available during any
activity.
Any equipment used during the
activity either left for at least 72
hours before re-use or sanitised
thoroughly before re-use.
An attempt should be made to
keep the group participants the
same, have the same group
staff with them along with the
same WHCC staff instructing
activities.

- F-F refers to face-to-face meeting.
- PPE refers to Personal Protective Equipment.
